Last Minute Interview Tips

As seniors start the job search, and underclassmen continue their career and internship exploration, we've compiled some last minute interview tips to think about as you prepare for the first impression.



- ◆ Do your homework; be sure to research the company prior to the interview
- ◆ Rehearse practice questions, or sign up for a mock interview; have several pre-prepared questions to ask the interviewer
- ◆ Arrive 10-15 minutes early
- ◆ Arrive prepared with multiple copies of your resume and reference page
- ◆ Be appropriately and professionally dressed
- ◆ Greet with a firm handshake and maintain good eye contact throughout the interview
- ◆ Stay positive and enthusiastic
