Bertha's Landfall

- July 12, 1996
- Category 1 storm (105 mph winds)
- Wrightsville Beach,NC
- Losses estimated at \$270 million
- 8 related deaths

Fran's Landfall

- September 5, 1996
- Category 3 storm (115 mph winds)
- Cape Fear, NC
- Losses estimated at \$3.2 billion
- 34 related deaths
