Students who have completed the above courses have met 12 of the 24 science credits needed for the RN to BSN/ RN to MSN at the University of Delaware. Additional science requirements include a minimum of one course in each of these categories: biology, chemistry, and nutrition totaling 12 or more credits. The remaining non-nursing support courses for the RN to BSN/ RN to MSN are as follows:

- Statistics 200 or higher (3 credits)
- *Restricted Elective (3 credits)
- Free Electives (15)- 10 credits already met with
HIST 101, HIST 102, HUMT 200, HPED 150
- Multicultural Course Requirement-one approved course must stress multicultural, ethics, or gender related content. This may be fulfilled through a required or elective course.

Graduates from Atlantic Cape Community College's AD Nursing Program will receive 30 nursing credits for their successful completion of the registered nurse license exam. This matrix is to be used as an example of possible transfer credit. Official transfer credit is determined at time of application to the program.
