Students who have completed the above courses have met 16 of the 24 science credits needed for the RN to BSN & RN to MSN Majors at the University of Delaware.

Additional science requirements include a minimum of one course in each of these categories: chemistry (103 at C.C.C.) and nutrition (BIO 203 at C.C.C.). If the total number of credits is still less than 24, students may choose courses from any of the 5 science categories. The remaining non-nursing support courses are as follows:

Statistics 200 (MAT 127 at C.C.C.) 3 credits

*Restricted Elective 3 credits

Free Electives 15 credits (3 credits already met with MAT 123 at C.C.C.)

Multicultural Course Requirement- one approved course must stress multicultural, ethics, or gender related content. This may be fulfilled through a required or elective course.

Graduates from Cecil Community College's AD Nursing Program will receive 30 nursing credits for their successful completion of the registered nurse licensure exam. This matrix is to be used as an example of possible transfer credit. Official transfer credit is determined at time of application program. See the GPA requirements for each program as well.
