Students that have completed the above courses have met 11 of the 24 science credits needed for the RN to BSN/MSN program at the University of Delaware. Additional science requirements would include a minimum of one course in each of these categories: biology, chemistry, and nutrition. If the total credits are still less than 24, students may choose courses from any of the 5 science categories to reach the total of 24. The remaining non nursing support courses are as follows:

- LifeSpan Development (3 credits)
- Sociology (3 credits)
- \*Restricted Elective (3 credits)
- Free Electives (15 credits)- 5-6 of these credits will have been met with OCC'S Humanities requirement plus HPEP 110 or HEHP 225.
- Multicultural Course Requirement- one approved course must stress multicultural, ethics, Or gender related content. This may be fulfilled through a required or elective course.

Graduates from Ocean County College's AD Nursing Program will receive 30 nursing credits for their successful completion of the registered nursing licensure exam. **This matrix is to be used as an example of possible transfer credit.** Official transfer credit is determined at time of application to the program.
