Section 3 – Meetings

The Chapter shall hold a meeting of its members at least once a month during the school term. The Chapter shall provide notice of such meetings by email and fliers.

ARTICLE II – BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 – General Powers

Except as otherwise provided herein, all Chapter activities shall be exercised by or under the authority of the Board of Directors, and the affairs of the Chapter shall be managed under the direction of the Board. The directors of the chapter shall in all cases act as a Board and may adopt such rules and regulations for the conduct of their meetings and the management of the Chapter as they deem proper, but not inconsistent with these Bylaws, the covenant agreement entered into between Habitat and the Chapter (the "Covenant"), the Articles of Association, the rules and regulations of the College, and the laws of the State of Delaware.

Section 2 – Number, Tenure, and Qualifications

The Board of Directors shall be composed of a flexible number of members, adjusting to suit the needs of the group on an annual basis. One advisor, a member of the faculty or staff, shall be in place. Each director shall hold office for a term of one year and until a successor shall have been duly elected and qualified. A director shall assume office and be deemed duly elected and qualified for purposes of these Bylaws upon the adjournment of the meeting during which the director was elected, unless a later date is specified. In order to be elected to the Board, a director must be a member of the Chapter.

Section 3 – Election

The Board shall be self-perpetuating, and a new Board shall be elected each year. The initial Board shall be those individuals named in the Articles.

IV

In the event of the Chapter dissolving, all assets shall become property of the University of Delaware as the Chapter is under the University's tax identification number and a Registered Student Organization.

V

The Board of Directors shall have the authority to adopt bylaws for the Association and to appoint officers of the Association in accordance with said bylaws, which are consistent with these Articles of Association.

The initial Board of Directors shall consist of a flexible number of members, adjusting to the needs of the group in a particular year. The current Board consists of:
