

Constitution for Juggling Club

Preamble: We, the students at the University of Delaware, do hereby form the organization known as the Juggling Club for the purpose of providing a club where students can gather and juggle together. Secondly we would like to enhance other student's understanding of juggling and hopefully gain more interest.

Article I- The organization shall be known as the Juggling Club.

Article II- The object of this club is to allow students to collectively practice juggling and share knowledge that will help the development of others. We encourage jugglers of all skill levels to join in hopes that everyone will increase their talent to their individual goals. We also encourage people who participate in any type of object manipulation to join or club.

Article III- We are not affiliated with any other group on campus.

Article IV- Membership consists of any full-time matriculated undergraduate student of the University of Delaware who agrees with the object and purpose of this organization. In addition, we require that a student attend at least two meetings during the academic school year to be considered a member of the Juggling Club.

Article V- The organization agrees to adhere to all policies and procedures of the University and all local, state, and federal laws. Members will become acquainted with policies and procedures in the Official student handbook and other policies and procedures provided by the University. This organization is a viable, functioning organization, composed of at least six full time undergraduate students and we do not discriminate on the basis of race, creed, color, gender, age, religion, national origin, veteran, handicap status, or sexual orientation.

Article VI- Membership in the Juggling club will allow students to use community equipment that is provided by the club. Members will also gain access to personalized video analysis of their juggling form. Video will also be used to document progress and to show others what the club is about.

Article VII-

Section 1: President - This organization shall have a President with the duties of calling and running meetings and handling day-to-day affairs. The President shall be responsible for the registration of the Registered Student Organization and all required paperwork for the continuation of the organization, including the End-of-the-Year, Mid-Year, and Start-of-the-Year packets, and Summer Contact Information. The President will receive all information from the Activities and Programs Office from an undisclosed email database. This information is to be used to help your RSO function, so please disseminate the information accordingly. The president will help to appoint all standing and special committees.

Section 2: Vice-President - The Vice-President shall serve the role of President if the President is absent, unable to serve the duties of President, or if the President resigns. The Vice President should also be responsible for checking the organizations mailbox and for disseminating information about other activities offered by the other Registered Student Organizations and business promotions.

Section 3: Treasurer - The Treasurer shall be responsible for all group expenditures and revenues. The Treasurer shall write all checks and have all checks signed by the Activities and Programs staff for the purpose of the organization. The treasurer will also maintain all group ledgers. The treasurer should also be responsible for requesting funds from the allocation board.

Section 4: Secretary - The Secretary shall record the events of all meetings of this organization and shall maintain minutes of those meetings. The secretary shall take attendance of those present at group meetings as necessary. You may want to have the Secretary serve as the organizations historian with the goal of being able to pass on accurate records of what the groups has done over the past year and who was involved. The Secretary should also maintain the membership list and email database.

Article VIII- Qualifications for Officers - All Officers (or Executive Board Members) must be full time matriculated undergraduate students at the University of Delaware. You may also want to include that any potential officer must be able to complete a full calendar year (i.e. no second semester seniors).

Article IX- Election of officers – Elections of officers shall be decided by simple majority rule. In the case of a tie, the existing members who are not running for that office will decide who wins.

Article X- Voting in elections – In order to vote in elections, the member must attend at least 30% of the meetings

Article XI- Meetings will be held once per week on Thursdays at 7:00pm in the Bob Carpenter Center. Aside from the main meeting date on Thursday night’s additional optional meetings will be held on a email/phone based system.

Article XII- No dues required to be a full time member of the Juggling Club.

Article XIII- There are no by laws for the Juggling Club

Article XIV- The Job of the Advisor is to mediate conflicts or decisions that members will encounter throughout the school year.

Article XV- Rules for ratifying constitution- simple majority vote will be sufficient to ratify constitution.

Article XVI- Statement of Financial – Everything goes to Activities and Programs.
