From your advisors desk....

Spring break is over and the midway point of the semester is here. It's time for you to do a status check. How are your classes going? Are your grades so far what you expected? How are you preparing for your finals and class projects? As you reflect on these questions, be honest with yourself and where you want to be at the end of the semester. Associate in Arts Student Leadership Group Formed

UD's Associate in Arts students have formed a leadership program called The Associates comprised of Associate in Arts students from Dover, Georgetown and Wilmington and those who have successfully made the transition to the Newark campus.

The Associates met for a day of training at the Biden Center in Lewes, Del., where the group worked on developing public speaking and goal setting skills and shared ideas and challenges they are faced with while completing the associate degree.

Students talked about ways to be more involved with events on the Newark campus, while maintaining their identities on their own campuses, and began developing a series of

semester-long workshops, "For Students, By Students," that can help in the transition from local campuses to Newark and tackling current issues.

Stephanie Krysiak, a sophomore in the Wilmington program, attended the daylong training session. "I learned a lot more about the Associate in Arts program, the different campuses and the students in the program. I learned it's the students who need to take action to become more involved with the Newark campus and create more activities on their own campuses."

Jeremy Baron, a student in the Wilmington program, said he believes The Associates "can accomplish things that will benefit potential and current Associate in Arts students."

Renee Fisher, academic advisor on the Dover campus, has worked with the Associate in Arts students since the program began in 2004. "Our Associate in Arts students are absolutely amazing," she said. "The whole day was inspirational. The students developed several great ideas that will benefit their fellow students and the program. We are all excited to move forward with this new leadership program."

The Associates will sponsor events this spring and summer for new associate degree students starting in the fall and hold workshops on each campus.
