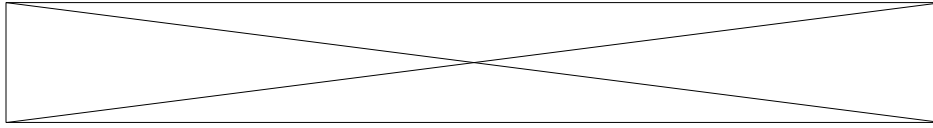

Thanks to the donation of a New York company, disabled Delawareans will be able to enjoy bicycling at Bellevue State Park in Wilmington.

Any Delawarean can walk into Bellevue State Park and borrow a bicycle free of charge during park hours.

Now, the Rifton Company of New York has donated a special adaptive tricycle that will be available for disabled Delawareans who don't have the balance to ride the standard bikes.

For parents, it's a special gift that will give their disabled children a chance to do something they could never do previously.

And, for many parents it's more than an issue of exercise.

It's an issue of freedom---the freedom for their kids to do anything that anybody else can. The donated adaptive tricycle is worth an estimated 23-hundred dollars.
