- **OR:** You have completed an undergraduate (bachelor's) degree and would like to learn the language of graduate research English

* This course replaces EAP VI R/W for graduate CAP students

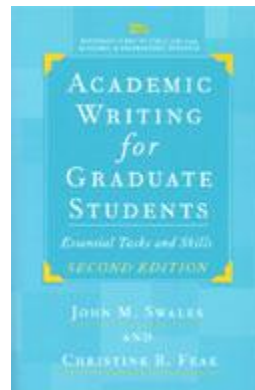
Learning Outcomes

- Read and write **for your graduate degree**
- Use sources by **paraphrasing, quoting, summarizing, and citing**
- Understand and use a wide range of academic **vocabulary**
- Understand and use the **grammar** of written English at the graduate level

Typical Assignments Include

- Reading and summarizing articles in your field of study
- Conducting library research into a topic of interest from your graduate program
- Understanding and interpreting data
- Writing a literature review
- Investigating the style of writing in your graduate discipline

Questions

- Should I take Grad VI or EAP VI RW?

If you intend to study for a [graduate](#) degree (MA, MS, MBA, MPA, PhD, etc.), then you should take Grad VI RW. (If you intend to study for an [undergraduate](#) degree in the U.S., you must take EAP VI not Grad VI.) The difference is that EAP VI prepares you for the wide range of reading and writing tasks you will experience as an *undergraduate*; Grad VI focuses on the very different types of reading and writing that *graduate* students do.

- Can I meet my CAP requirement with Grad VI?

Yes. Please consult the student handbook or the CAP coordinator for information about matriculation requirements.

- I am not a CAP student. Can I take Grad VI?

You must have completed your undergraduate degree to take Grad VI, but if space is available, non-CAP students are welcome.
