This concentration requires the choice of **one** of the following options:

- Civilization and Culture
- Ancient Greek and Latin Language and Literature
- Latin Language and Literature

Students must see their advisor or the Associate Chair of the department to choose one of these options.

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

13 courses (39 credits), as follows:

- Three courses** on Ancient Greek and Roman authors or topics chosen from among the following FLLT courses: 9
 - FLLT 202 Biblical and Classical Literature
 - FLLT 316 Gods, Heroes, and Monsters: Classical Mythology
 - FLLT 322 Topic: In Love and War: Greek Tragedy
 - FLLT 322 Topic: Antiquity through Modern Eyes
 - FLLT 320/322 (variable topics, genres, periods, and authors)
 - FLLT 330 Society and Spectacle in Ancient Greece and Rome
 - FLLT 330 Roman Rulers and Rebels

OPTION REQUIREMENTS

- Two courses** in either Greek or Latin above the 100 level from: 6
 - Either LATN 213, 214, 2XX, 3XX, 4XX or GREK 213, 214, 2XX, 3XX, 4XX
- One course** of a related elective in ARTH or THEA 3
- One course** of a related elective in HIST or ANTH 3
- One course** of a related elective in PHIL or POSC 3
- Five courses** in ANTH, ARTH, FLLT, GREK, HIST, LATN, PHIL, POSC, THEA of which at least 6 must be at the 300 or 400 level 15

Option II: Greek and Latin Language and Literature

- GREK 101: Elementary Ancient Greek 3
- GREK 102: Elementary Ancient Greek, cont. 3
- Six courses** in Greek and Latin above the 100 level with six credits at or above the 300 level and at least six credits in each language 18
- Two courses** of related electives in ANTH, ARTH, FLLT, GREK, HIST, LATN, PHIL, POSC, THEA 6

Option III: Latin Language and Literature

- Eight courses** in Latin above the 100 level with at least six credits at the 300 level and at least six credits at the 400 level 24
- Two courses** of related electives in ANTH, ARTH, FLLT, GREK, HIST, LATN, PHIL, POSC, THEA 6

NOTE: Students must receive prior consent of their advisor for the selection of all elective courses in Ancient Greek and Roman Studies.

ELECTIVES

After required courses are completed, sufficient elective credits must be taken to meet the minimum credit requirement for the degree.
