  - Postmarked May 1<sup>st</sup> if applying for Financial Aid
  - Postmarked May 15<sup>th</sup> if you are not applying for Financial Aid
- Complete high school transcript including current grades to date**
  - Have your school guidance counselor send an official copy of your **ENTIRE high school transcript**.
- PSAT/SAT or ACT scores**
  - This may be included on your high school transcript – check with your guidance counselor.
- Course Registration Form** *[see page five (5) of the application]*
  - The applicant's Social Security Number is required for this form. It is required data, used by the University for registration purposes. Summer College does not use it to personally identify you. Each student will be assigned a Student ID number once he/she has been accepted into Summer College.
  - For home phone, please do not use your personal cell phone number.
  - For daytime phone, use your cell phone number or your parent's/guardian's work number.
  - **Please make sure you complete the Residency for Tuition Purposes accurately and completely [see page five (5) of the application]. Errors in certifying your residency will create course registration delays.**
    - Delaware (in-state) residents will have to certify that they have maintained a permanent domicile in Delaware for at least 12 consecutive months in order to qualify for the in-state Program Fee. You will be asked to enter the month, day, and year that your residency began. *(Usually, this is your birth date if you were born in Delaware or the date you established a permanent domicile in Delaware. Then you will be asked to enter a date to which your residency has continued. Usually, that is the date you completed the Registration form.)* **Don't forget to sign the in-state statement.**
    - Non-Delaware (out-of-state) residents must sign at the appropriate place stating that they are not a Delaware resident and do not qualify for the in-state Program Fee.
- If Applying for Financial Aid:** The application and Request for Financial Aid (with all additional documents) must be postmarked by May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012.

## Section 5 – Course Information

1. Summer College (SC) students may request to be enrolled in any combination of Core Courses and Second Summer Session courses as long as they register for a minimum of six (6) but not more than seven (7) credits.
2. Do not schedule two (2) courses that overlap or meet at the same time.
3. Core Courses will consist exclusively of SC students. Second Summer Session courses will consist of SC students and regularly matriculated students. It has been our experience that some Ivy League schools will not accept transfer credit for courses that were not open to enrollment for regularly matriculated college students. Therefore, if you plan on attending an Ivy League school, you may want to select courses offered in the Second Summer Session rather than Core Courses.
4. We strongly suggest that you do NOT enroll in courses that might potentially conflict with AP credit you may receive.
5. SC Core courses and Second Summer Session courses are identified by the course title, such as CHEM 103, and the section number, such as -030. All SC Core Courses have a section number of -030, so the full course name for General Chemistry would be CHEM 103-030. Second Summer Session courses will have similar course title abbreviations. Section numbers will be in the format 9XX. The course information needed to schedule these courses will be listed on the Summer Sessions website: <http://www.udel.edu/summer>, beginning in March.
