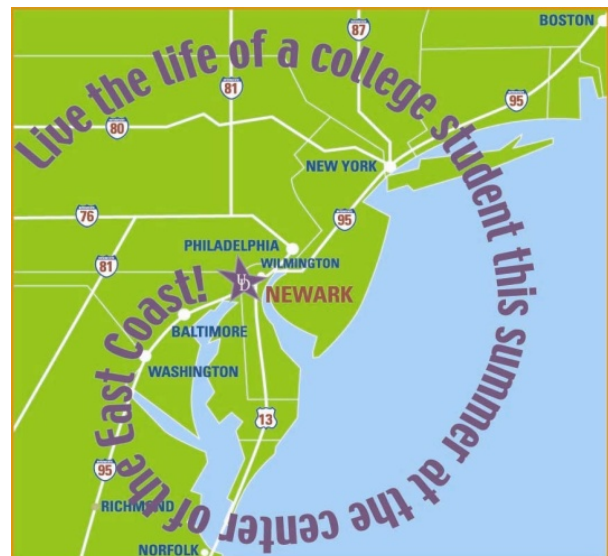

Eligibility

Successful Honors Program Summer College students should:

- Be taking college prep, honors, and/or AP coursework
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Have a combined score of at least 1000 on the Math and Verbal sections of the PSAT or SAT
- Summer College students must be 16 years of age by the start of Summer College and completed their sophomore or junior year of high school

Program Fee

Delaware residents: \$3,500

Nonresidents: \$6,500

The program fee covers:

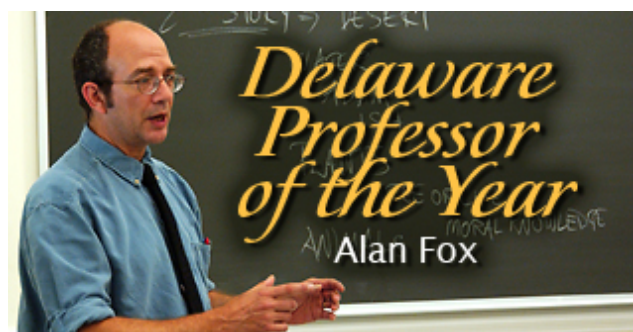
- Housing and meals for the 5-week session
- Tuition and fees for 6 or 7 college credits
- Use of all University facilities and intramural athletic fields and courts, including the student fitness center
- Most extracurricular activities, programs, and trips

Scholarships and Financial Aid

- Financial Aid awarded on the combined basis of academic merit and financial need.
