If a student's background and/or occupational objectives warrant the recommendation of a course not covered on the above lists, a substitution may be requested. All course substitutions must be recommended by the student's advisor and approved by the IFS Department Chair and Assistant Dean. (Appropriate forms are available from the IFS Department or the Office of Student Support Services.) A given course substitution pertains to a specific degree option and is not binding if the student changes his major subsequent to a request for substitution. Students are strongly urged to submit a substitution request during pre-registration or prior to the end of the add/drop period so that its acceptability is known before the course is completed.
