**James Brophy** specializes in modern European history, particularly the social and political history of nineteenth-century Germany. He received his B.A. from Vassar College and did his graduate training at Universität Tübingen and Indiana University. He has written *Capitalism, Politics, and Railroads in Prussia, 1830-1870* (Columbus: Ohio State UP, 1998) and *Popular Culture and the Public Sphere in the Rhineland, 1800-1850* (Cambridge: Cambridge UP, 2007) as well as co-edited *Perspectives from the Past: Sources in Western Civilization* (New York: W.W. Norton, 1998; 3<sup>rd</sup> ed., 2005). He is currently at work on a book-length project examining popular literacy in Western Europe during the nineteenth century.

#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

##### **MALS667: National Socialism and The Holocaust**

This seminar examines recent literature on National Socialism, Adolf Hitler, the Nazi state, and the Holocaust. One half of the course addresses German society under National Socialist rule; the other focuses on the planning, implementation, and legacies of the Holocaust.
