MINOR IN LEADERSHIP

The minor in Leadership requires 18 credit hours, distributed as follows: the three LEAD core courses listed below (9 credits) and three additional courses of restricted electives (9 credits) selected in consultation with and approved by the student's minor advisor. One of these restricted electives must be selected from approved COMM courses. Six of the nine elective credits must be from outside the student's major field of study. The electives must be chosen from the following list of **Restricted Electives**. You may choose to either concentrate your electives in one category, or spread out your electives to cover the categories of Leadership in Context, Integrity and Ethics, and Leadership Competencies. All courses included in the minor must be completed with a grade of C- or better.
