The Department of History at the University of Delaware is seeking instructors for select courses in our curriculum. Qualified candidates will have formal teaching experience and hold a PhD or MA in history. Instructors must be available to teach in person on our Newark, DE campus, but online teaching opportunities (particularly during our 5-week winter and summer sessions) might also be available. Successful hires for the 2023-24 academic year would likely also be offered courses in subsequent years.

Supplemental Faculty positions are part-time, non-benefitted positions. Instructors holding the PhD would be paid at least \$5940 per in-person course with ten or more students enrolled. Those holding an MA would be paid at least \$5028 for comparably enrolled courses.
