








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
Children Make Up One-Fifth of Delaware's Population

Racial and ethnic composition of individuals by generation, Delaware, 2023








Less Than 1 in 25 Kids Ages 18 or Under Lack Health Insurance in Delaware

Medicaid/CHIP annual enrollment for children ages 0-18, Delaware




Delaware Disenrollments in Medicaid/CHIP Began in June 2023

Characteristics of children in households related to mental health, Delaware, October 18-October 30, 2023




Majority of Households Experienced Some Level of Difficulty in Finding Mental Health Treatment for Children

Infant mortality rate per 1,000 live births by race, Delaware






Infant mortality rate per 1,000 live births, Delaware, Counties, and City of Wilmington



Classroom closures across center based programs, Delaware, December 2022




Majority of Early Care and Education Providers Report Difficulty Filling Staff Roles




Chronic Absence Rates Were Impacted Negatively by the COVID-19 Pandemic and Have Not Yet Returned to Pre-Pandemic Levels

Percentage of public-school students chronically absent, Delaware





More Than One-Fifth of Delaware Students Were Chronically Absent During the 2022/23 School Year





Percentage of children under 18 years in poverty, Delaware and Counties

Delaware and Counties, 2017-2021



Child Poverty More Than Doubled From 2021 to 2022 According to the Supplemental Poverty Measure


Individuals in poverty according to the Supplemental Poverty Measure, U.S. and Delaware, 2021 and 2022



737 mobile pantries received 80,291 household visits with 4,633,555 pounds of food distributed



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



Neighborhood safety youth perception, Delaware, 2023



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In 2020 Firearms Became the Leading Cause of Death of U.S. Youth


Number of deaths by leading cause of mortality for children (ages 1-19), U.S., 2020

Firearm mortality rates per 100,000 children (ages 1-19) by type of firearm death, U.S.



Number of substantiated child abuse and neglect cases, Delaware




Child Abuse Takes Several Forms


