

Things that might happen with your chicks...



Some of the eggs may not hatch. Some eggs will stop developing before they are ready to hatch. It is normal in nature that not every egg will hatch.

If the chick is stuck in the egg and not fully hatching, we must leave the chick alone. If it is not strong enough to hatch, it is not strong enough to survive. We know that you want to help but letting nature take its course is best.





Some chicks may have a hurt leg, this could also happen to the chick when it is trying to come out of its shell. If you have a chick with a hurt leg, please try and keep it separate from the other chicks and see how it does. You can always call if you have questions!

Please be gentle when handling the chicks to ensure that they do not get any boo-boos. Remember, always hold them with 2 hands!
