GROW YOUR OWN BEANS

General Information

- Phaseolus vulgaris, Beans
- Fabaceae family
- Sunlight: full sun.
- Soil conditions: well-drained, fertile soil.
- Pole, bush, shelling, and filet types.
- Green, yellow, and burgundy varieties.

Successful Cultivars

- Kentucky Blue (65 days) Sweet, stringless, 7" long pods. Pole type. (pictured here)
- Provider (50 days) Easy to grow, early bean, germinates well in cool soil. Bush type.
- Black Coco (95 days) 5" long pods, easy to pick.

Common Pests & Diseases

- Mexican bean beetles (pictured here)
- Cucumber beetles
- Spider mites
- Bacterial leaf disease
