Expectations

UD Student Alumni Ambassadors are expected to:

- Attend meetings 2x per month during the fall and spring semesters.
- Assist with the planning and execution of UDSAA projects throughout the year.
- Volunteer and assist for a minimum of 20 hours per semester. These volunteer opportunities will vary based on need of the Office of Development and Alumni Relations and the university.

The minimum qualifications to serve as **UD Student Alumni Ambassador** are as follows:

- Undergraduate status at the University of Delaware.
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50.
- Good disciplinary standing with the Office of Student Conduct. By completing this application, you are giving permission to contact the Office of Student Conduct to review your judicial record.
- OPTIONAL: Submit a recommendation form (found via the application portal), submit resume, attend a UDSAA Information Session.
