

Expanding access and enabling success for students

- Budgeting \$168M in **undergraduate financial aid** for the 2022-23 academic year, up 86% since 2016
- Continuing to develop the First State Promise Program, which covers tuition and fees for Delawareans whose families earn less than \$75,000 a year
- Strengthening and expanding the Associate in Arts Program, offering more academic pathways for Delawareans, many of whom come from low-income, first-generation or underrepresented minority populations
- Offering the Early College Credit Program allows Delaware high school students to earn a whole semester of UD credits while taking online courses alongside UD students

IMPACT: Four-year graduation rate of 72% puts UD among the top 10 primarily residential public universities across the nation


