



FINANCING A UNIVERSITY OF DELAWARE STUDY ABROAD EXPERIENCE

UD STUDY ABROAD AWARDS

The Institute for Global Studies automatically considers every UD Study Abroad applicant for a need-based award. Students are notified of all awards at the time of acceptance into the study abroad program. These awards are listed as pending aid on My Finances and are used to offset program charges. Students may also apply for the Delaware Diplomats Program in which they can earn additional funds. Awards cannot be used for the required initial \$1,000 charge.

FINANCIAL AID FOR UD STUDY ABROAD FALL & SPRING SEMESTERS

UD students may use the federal financial aid they receive (Pell and SEOG grants, as well as Direct Student and PLUS loans) or alternative loans through private educational lenders to offset the cost of a UD study abroad experience. Aid is applied to the student account the same way it is when studying on campus. In order to be eligible for any federal awards, students must have a current academic year FAFSA on file (UD code 001431). Students are limited by the Cost of Attendance (COA) for the particular semester in which they are traveling (not including existing credit balances). Refunds are not available for semester credit balances prior to the first day of class.

UNIVERSITY AID

If eligible, students can use university scholarships and grants (except "On-Campus Grants" for Delawareans) for a UD Study Abroad program for Fall or Spring Semester. Please note that students must meet renewability requirements in order for awards to be credited to their accounts.

FINANCIAL AID FOR UD STUDY ABROAD WINTER & SUMMER SESSIONS

Students may be eligible for a limited amount of federal Pell grant for the Winter or Summer Sessions. Additionally, students may borrow any remaining federal Direct Student loan eligibility from the academic year or through the federal PLUS loan program up to the Cost of Attendance (COA) for that term, provided the program earns at least 6 credits, to cover study abroad costs. Alternative loans may also be used for study abroad experiences in Winter or Summer. Refunds for any credit balance will be available after the free drop/add deadline in that session (as defined by the academic calendar).

ADVANCED PLANNING FOR STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMS AND AID

While aid can only be used for the academic term in which it is granted, a credit balance on a student's account can be used to help offset future charges. To do this, plan ahead. Additional credit on the student account is usually created by loans (PLUS or other alternative) and is based on borrowing eligibility in one term or more leading up to the Study Abroad term.
