

UD SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS—NEWARK

The University of Delaware offers a variety of grants and scholarships (money that does not have to be repaid) to students during the admission process.

A separate application is not required for merit scholarships and all first-time out-of-state students are reviewed for these based upon all materials and information supplied with the admission application. Grants consideration requires the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

UD aims to make a UD education affordable to all qualified Delaware residents and offers a need-based financial aid program for Delawareans. Students who file the FAFSA and meet certain eligibility requirements may attend UD tuition-free.

OTHER TYPES OF AID

Federal Grants*

Based on low Expected Family Contributions and high financial need

Federal Student Loans*

May or may not be based on financial need; does not require credit check; must be repaid

Federal Work Study*

Employment funding offered based on financial need

Federal PLUS Loans*

Offered in the parent's name; not based on financial need; requires credit check; must be repaid

Alternative Loans

Offered in student's name; not based on financial need; requires credit check; must be repaid

*Requires submission of the FAFSA

SEED SCHOLARSHIP—ASSOCIATE IN ARTS

The SEED Scholarship program covers tuition for full-time students enrolled in the Associate in Arts Program (AAP). Students must be Delaware residents who graduate from a Delaware high school with a 2.5 or higher GPA, enter directly into AAP, and have not been convicted of a felony. These awards may be replaced by the Federal Pell Grant for qualified students. The FAFSA is required to be considered.

INSTALLMENT PLAN

The University offers an Installment Plan where semester payments can be split into four monthly installments, or eight total monthly installments over the academic year. A \$50 fee per semester applies.

According to a recent survey, 95% of UD undergraduates were employed or attending graduate or professional school within six months of graduating.
