

EHS Inspections

EHS inspections went well for the department but we can still do better! Waste management and Chemical safety are two areas that were found to be an issue in most labs. All of the findings are avoidable, just remember to:

- Close all waste containers (including lab trash boxes)
- · Label all waste bottles and reagent containers
- Date your chemicals! Especially the peroxide formers.
- Conduct quarterly self-inspections to check your lab's progress.

There is no need to treat, quench, or bulk your unwanted chemicals before EHS takes them. If your lab has chemicals that are no longer needed, just keep them in the original container and submit an EHS (Web Form) request for chemical pickup. It's that easy!
