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Checks on Academic Standards



- All graduate course grades calculate into the cumulative GPA
- Audit status **does not apply** toward the degree
- Undergraduate courses **do not apply** toward the degree





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University-Wide Policies



- Maintain continuous registration to be eligible to remain in the program
- Maintain B average as minimum/academic probation
- An overall cumulative GPA of 3.00 is required for the degree, as well as a cumulative GPA of 3.00 in the courses directly required for the degree

- Academic honesty and integrity lie at the heart of educational enterprise- in research, papers and projects
- Students are expected to follow the UD Writing Standard
 - Quotation marks are used to incorporate another person’s exact words into your own writing—otherwise it is plagiarism
 - Reference articles found on the web properly
 - Properly reference secondary sources
- Lack of understanding or know-how is not an excuse
- Use Resources:
 - Library sponsored workshops on RefWorks, Zotero to Manage Citations, EndNote
 - Writing Center

Some Savvy Advice
